CM praises SRB for achieving target

KARACHI: The Sindh Revenue Board (SRB) has recovered Rs. 55 billion upto May 30, 2016 and by the end of the current financial year it would achieve the target of Rs 61 billion.

This was disclosed in a meeting held under the chairmanship of Sindh Chief Minister Syed Qaim Ali Shah to review the kitty of the government for finalizing the next budget here at the CM House on Tuesday.
